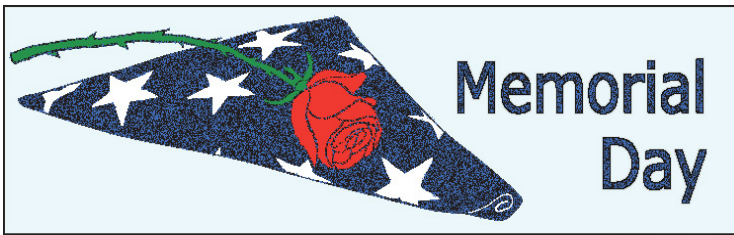

The Mass for Memorial Day will be celebrated at 8:45 a.m. at St. Ann's Parish. The Hibernians both women and men will also share in the mass.

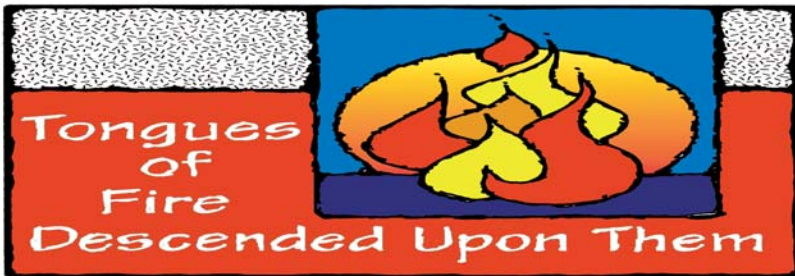
June 1st. We will began summer office hours. the office will be open 9:00am to 1:00 p.m. each week day.

SIGNIFICANT DAY

“And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were” (Acts 2:2).
